

Step ①


What do you want in particular to talk about within your table's topic? **Why**?

Step (1) Let's share!

Each person speaks:



- **What** you want to talk about.
- **Why** you want to talk about it.



The Japan Association for Self-Access Learning (JASAL) will hold this year's conference as a joint event with the Sojo University Teaching & Learning forum (SUTLF), which is the flagship event of the NanKyu Chapter of the Japan Association for Language Teaching (JALT). This year's theme is *Making Connections*. There are multiple connections within the field of second language education. Some examples of these include connections between educators and students, in- and out-of-class learning, theory and practice, and culture and language. We hope that this theme inspires and expands participants' thinking of the complex web consisting of, but certainly not limited to, people, place, practice, theory, materials, administration, curriculum, culture, and technology. It is our belief that, in thinking about these various connections in new ways, we may gain new perspectives and insights into language education.

	5 min	Participants have 3 minutes to write their name of the topic they'd like to discuss. Meanwhile, move the chairs and put Group Number Sign in groups. 4-5 per group.
	5 min	1. Tally and decide the 5-6 groups. 2. Announce the groups. Everyone moves to the group number location and sit.
10:20-10:22	2 min	Be ready for session. Hand out Entakun, paper, color pen set. Greet each other. (just name and class) Each group write TOPIC in the middle with BLACK pen.
10:22-10:25	2 min	Step 0: Everyone writes on the paper 1 specific thing they want to talk about in the group regarding their topic. (2 minute)
10:25-10:40	15 min	Step 1: Sharing: Each person speaks the topic they want and why. Facilitator cues the time and announces (2minute x 4-5)
10:40-10:49	5 min	Step 2: Each person comments and after 1 min, turn the table clockwise (2 min x 4-5)
10:49-11:10	15 min	Step 3:Free discussion: Participants add anything that they've talked about on the paper.
11:10-		Come up with question to ask the panelists
11:15-		Each group share what they talked about to the whole group, and ask question for the panelists. We keep the question. Write on whiteboard / powerpoint?
11:20-11:50	30 min	Introduce International Practitioners, Each group will ask question

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
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
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
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
